Central Coast Chapter – January 14, 2003

Meeting called to order by Bud Silva, Chapter President.

New Business

Nominations were accepted and election held for Chapter Board officers.

Bud Silva (SLO PD) reminded the new officers of the regular Chapter sponsorship of the Academic Achievement Award presented to the top academic student of each Basic Academy course at Alan Hancock College.

POST Report

Steve Chaney reminded everyone of the large and diverse amount of Terrorism training courses available throughout the State. He made special note of 3 new classes that have been added to the list. These courses can be found on the POST web-site.

Chaney reported that POST, PORAC and other organizations are fighting a lawsuit filed by the LA Times attempting to skirt a 1043 motion. They are trying to assure protection of the personal information of officers that is contained in POST's database.

Chaney reports the State Dept of Finance is attempting to take control of the funds generated from fines/assessments that are mandated by the penal code to go to POST for Training Reimbursement. If this happens, this will result in a \$28 million cut in the POST Travel-Reimbursement budget, effective July, 2003. He encouraged all Police Chiefs, Sheriffs, etc. to make their feelings of opposition to this proposal known. POST is also anticipating a potential \$8 million

cut out of their budget in March, 2003. (Note: Download bulletin 2003-2 from www.post.ca.gov.)

Chaney reports he is still working on putting together a "Mini" Training Needs Assessment for the region on February 19th and 20th, 2003. He is looking for a facility in the Buellton/Solvang area so that it is centrally located. The bulk of this meeting will be spent putting together an action plan for perishable skills training in our area. The meeting will be done on a smaller scale than in previous years due to budget concerns. For this reason, only Training Managers from each agency should attend, or that person who has the most complete knowledge of the needs and capabilities of the agency.

Craig Hendricks (Arroyo Grande PD) reports that his agency is doing an "in-house" Racial Profiling course throughout the year. If anyone is in need of sending someone to this course, let him know. His number – (805) 473-5123.
