Central Coast Meeting Minutes Tuesday, May 11, 2004, 10:00 a.m.

NEW BUSINESS:

- ✍ July Meeting and TNA in Monterey - The July meeting will not be held in Monterey due to POST budget issues. A new date for a TNA (Training Needs Assessment) will be discussed. Charles Fox mentioned the last TNA was in 2000.
- ✍ Summary of 5/7/04 State CAPTO Meeting - Meeting was cancelled.
- ✍ Scott Lewis Liability Course Success - Thirty of thirty-four students attended the liability course presented by Scott Lewis of Perry, Johnson, Anderson, Miller & Moskowitz, at the PG&E training center on May 5, 2004. P.O.S.T., CAPTO and Alan Hancock College sponsored the training and each student paid \$25, which came to \$750 earned. The law firm was paid \$700, for a \$50 gain, minus beverage expenses. About \$25 will be

deposited into CAPTO's account. The student evaluations expressed a worthwhile course, due to the instructor's knowledge, humor and presentation.

ROUNDTABLE:

Tracy Martinez and Dwayne Heath (Ventura County Sheriff) report the significant impact of budget cuts and layoffs in Ventura County. 40 Jail Personnel will be laid off, 7 Sgt.'s will be demoted and 40 Patrol Deputies will be brought back to the jail. This will bring Ventura County Sheriff Patrol back to the level of deployment in 1987.

A monthly calendar of training was provided and Tracy Martinez can be contacted for further details at tracy.martinez@mail.co.ventura.ca.us ICI (Institute of Criminal Investigation) will be hosting a course on June 21 -25, 2004 in Ventura.

Larry Cooper (Cuesta College Police Department) reported the cancellation of the Train the Trainer Course for Less Lethal Munition Course which was to be held in May 2004. Larry will be looking to reschedule the training in late August or September 2004.

Al Avila (Alan Hancock College) reports that the 300'x400' EVOC pad has been paved and fenced. This will accommodate precision driving, accident avoidance and skid car training. Pursuit driving will stay at the airport for now. The next project will be a 3 story tower for entry, approach and rappel training.

The next Basic Academy will start 7/29/04 with pre-academy dates of 7/17/04 and 7/18/04. The class is full and there are 25 potential students on the waiting list. AHC is looking for qualified instructors for the Dispatch Academy, Basic Traffic Collision Investigation and Crime Scene Investigation.

P.O.S.T. REPORT:

- ✂ EDI Transition System - POST Senior Consultant, Steve Chaney, reported on the EDI transition system and Skills and Knowledge Module conversion. There are 5,000 skills and knowledge modules that need to be converted by 7/04. The dates for the Course Administration Seminar are 6/1/04 -6/30/04 in Redondo Beach. Contact Steve if you are interested in attending.
- ✂ FTO Program - Steve Chaney reminded members that their agencies need to submit their FTO Program to POST by July 1, 2004. If any agency already has an exemption (such as D.A. Offices), the exemption does not need to be re-submitted.
- ✂ Domestic Violence Update Training - Steve Chaney reports the 2hr requirement for Domestic Violence Update training can be met by having Patrol Officers review the new POST guidelines. POST will release a new DVD around 9/04 which covers the new material.
- ✂ Steve Chaney gave a visual demonstration of the EDI Transition System and S&K test.
