State Board Minutes Meeting May 20, 2005

Meeting was called to order by Central Coast President Charles Fox. Eleven members were in attendance.

Reports

Executive Director: Dave Althausen has stepped down from his position as Executive Director. Jalaine Hogue is now the new Executive Director.

Finances: Tom McMains provided a financial report. There is a \$790 CPA bill pending and membership invoicing will start soon.

South Region: Larger training venues are being planned with two rates (CAPTO members and non-members). It was suggested CAPTO pick up the TNA's POST is no longer doing.

Central Valley Region: There has been a complete change of officers. Meetings continue to be the first Tuesday every month with good response to the meeting.

North Region: There has been such poor attendance at meetings, there haven't been any scheduled. Many feel this is largely attributed to cancellation of travel during tight budget times. The size of this region was also mentioned as it relates to the difficulty of travel.

Central Coast Region: Meetings are every other month and remain strong. Large presentations have been accomplished and more are being planned.

POST Advisory Committee: Andy provided an overview of his role. Many members probably do not realize the impact CAPTO has with the Commission.

POST: Bud Lewallen is the new POST representative to the CAPTO Executive Board. Bud distributed information from recent reports that can be found on the POST website. (Rosanna will provide links to this information on the CAPTO website.) There are five new commissioners and all positions are filled. The budget is good and they anticipate programs and funding to continue. POST has gained six (6) positions back from the nineteen (19) lost earlier. A deficit is projected in two-three years. Another issue on training compliance may put POST back in court. A recruitment symposium is planned for November and a

possible instructor symposium next year to meet new academy instructor mandates.

Newsletter/Website Update: Newsletter continues to go out quarterly. The website hosting service has changed with the recent folding of Advantage Web Design. Rosanna was able to secure hosting service with Daryl Jones of San Mateo Regional Network (SMRN). Daryl was a great help in setting everything up and getting our files transferred. Members should not have noticed any change.

CPOA Membership Services: CAPTO is currently without a contract. CAPTO is currently only paying postage, software upgrades, printing costs. The Executive Director was urged to conduct a needs assessment on services with CPOA. A motion was made, amended and approved that Tom be reimbursed for the Quicken upgrade and take the funds from the CAPTO account to pay for it. Tom reminded CAPTO members that they must meet at least twice a year to prevent jeopardizing their not-for-profit status. Year end tax reports are due and must be ready for the CPA by 9/15/05. It appears only \$10 is owed to the State Franchise Tax Board for this year's taxes. Tom also reminded everyone his email is t.mcmains@comcast.net. The board approved Tom McMains be reimbursed for travel. Lunch for board members was also approved.

Training Managers' Update Conference: There was considerable discussion around this topic as it applied to filling the training needs assessment void. A late fall/winter conference was suggested. POST certification with and without reimbursement was discussed. Charles Fox will take the lead on this project and continue discussions with POST.

Meeting called to order by Charles Fox, Chapter President. Charles Fox welcomed all the members and especially welcomed our newest member, Chris Clement, an Investigator with the Santa Barbara County District Attorney's Office.

Treasury Report

Larry Cooper, Treasurer, Cuesta College PD, reported approximate account balances as reflected in the previous financial report.

The Lt. Dave Grossman income and expenses report is as follows: \$3,999.00 Income, Expenses break down \$28.50

to Sgt. Gilligan for incidentals, \$46.89 to Larry Cooper for refreshments, \$4,596.25 to the Killology Group, for a total expense of \$4,671.64. CAPTO spent a total of \$672.64 for this training. All considered the training valuable and the expense minimal.

Larry Cooper also reported that he sent \$220.00 to C.A.P.T.O. State for the dues split.

New Business:

- Board Elections – President Charles Fox requested that the board stay “as is” unless there were any objections. Craig Hendricks made the **motion** that the current C.A.P.T.O. Central Coast Board remain the same with Al Avila seconding the motion. Current Vice President, Jalaine Hogue is anticipating taking a job offer as an Investigator with the Monterey County District Attorney’s Office, which would leave the Vice President position open. She has also accepted the CAPTO Executive Director position and cannot hold two offices. Thus, there is an opening on the Central Coast Board for the Vice President position. Anyone interested should contact President Charles Fox. If no one shows interest, the bylaws state that the President can (and will) appoint a Vice President. Your current CAPTO Central Coast Board is President - Charles Fox, Vice President – vacant, Sgt. At Arms - Craig Hendricks, Treasurer – Larry Cooper, Secretary – Cindy Dunn.
- The CAPTO State Board Meeting was held on Friday, May 20, 2005 at the PG&E training center. Two items to be addressed: 1) Executive Director Dave Althausen stepping down 2) Membership Services with CPOA and 3) How to build CAPTO membership in the North and South chapters. Charles Fox encouraged members to attend.
- State CAPTO Conference/Symposium? – Charles Fox is very interested in pursuing a State CAPTO Conference or Symposium for Training Managers, within 9 months to 1 year. He is contacting State Parks about the possibility of using the Asilomar

facility in Monterey for the training and consulting with POST to get the training reimbursable.

Allan Hancock College (Al Avila) – reported that the Basic Police Academy, starting on August 1, 2005 already has 37 un-sponsored applications, so far, and there are only 30 spots. Additionally, there are 200 applications that have not yet been returned. In July, 2005, restructuring decisions will be made for AHC/AOJ. It appears that several associate Dean’s positions will be eliminated and there is a possibility that AOJ will be combined with the Fire Program, and called “Public Safety”. In June 2005, the front offices of AHC will be remodeled and Genevieve Sweet will be temporarily relocated. Al asked that we be patient during this time as calls and responses may be slowed down. The EVOC site at the Santa Maria Airport is no longer available. The airport said they would lease to AHC for the HIGH price of \$15,000. This is not cost-effective as the airport site needs \$250,000 - \$300,000 in repairs. Paving a site on the S. Campus is a possibility. POST COMMISSION ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING REPORT

The last POST Commission Meeting was held on April 21, 2005 and the Advisory Committee to the Commission meeting was held on April 20, 2005 both in Burlingame.

The following topics of interest were covered:

1. POST staff is working on a Web-based training delivery system (learning portal) which would replace the Multi-Media (CD-ROM) based training.
2. Expanded Course Outline Exemption: an expanded course outline would not be required after initial certification for each subsequent presentation on the following courses; Regular Basic Course, PC 832, Level III Part 2, Level II, Level I, Specialized Investigator's Basic Course, Requalification Course, Public Safety Dispatchers' Basic Course, Investigation and Trial Preparation Course.
3. Approval of the new Personal History Statements for Peace Officer and Public Safety Dispatcher.
4. Approval of a contract with National Crime Investigation and Training to present crime scene forensic courses: 3-Basic Crime Scene Investigation and Reconstruction, 2-Advanced Crime Scene Investigation and Reconstruction, 2-Patterned Blood Investigation.
5. Approval of the POST SWAT Guidelines and Training Recommendations.
6. Acceptance of a CalEPA grant funding the design, implementation, and delivery of a course for Environmental Crimes Investigation.
7. Approval of a Law Enforcement Recruitment Symposium.

The next POST Commission Meeting and Advisory Committee will be held on July 20 & 21, 2005 in San Diego, CA.
