Call to Order (State President, Charles Fox)

Introductions

State Financial and Membership Report

- Kurt advised he has balanced the books back to January 2005. His goal is to revise and streamline the accounting process.
- Jalaine moved that active chapters continue billing at the local level. Kurt would bill inactive members. Charles seconded the motion and vote was unanimous. Kurt will work toward sending invoices for North and South regions in January.
- State Bank Account: \$3,247.97.
- Last complete membership list was distributed and will be reviewed by chapter presidents for updates needed. Feedback will be provided to Kurt. Jalaine will work on letter for all chapters to use to recruit new members.

Region & Chapter Reports

Central Valley (Darrell Hibbens)

- Will be contacting agencies not participating to host meetings.
- POST Commission meeting will be in Fresno on April 28th. CAPTO meeting will coincide and members were encouraged to attend the commission meeting.
- Central Valley will host a joint meeting with the Mother Lode Training Managers.
- \$977.12 in checking account and \$17,759.17 in savings.

Northern Chapter (Jalaine Hogue)

- North is currently inactive. Ways to boost membership was discussed. A motion was made for Jalaine to be added to the North bank account, as two signers on accounts is preferred practice. Charles seconded and vote was unanimous.
